- Meeting started at 9:06 AM. Pastor Pan opened in prayer.
- Pastoral Sharing
 - Update of the Pandemic and Church Reopening
 - COVID-19 confirmed cases continue to surge with milder symptoms
 - Confirmed cases also surge among church members and coworkers
 - In-person Sunday service attendance
 - CB and COM continue to grow a little bit ~70%
 - Still short of coworkers, especially in worship
 - A few "last minute" COVID-19 cases occurred in worship coworkers, presiders, preachers, etc.

- Request and issue
 - Due to the recent increases of violent and mass shooting events, pastoral staff suggest to resume the operation of the Church Safety Committee
 - The importance of building up the church member database and coordinating website operation?
 - The goal is to centralized database for the whole church
- Questions:
 - Why are we not supporting Hopi/Lynn missions?
 - Different youth pastor, different connections/priorities
 - Building up missions in Youth from the ground up after two years of not going on STM
 - What is the status of the Christian school proposal and what are the next steps?
 - Pastoral staff prepared a thorough report for the BOE to review
 - Based on other Christian schools that were started from the church, thereare challenges that develop ove rtime that need to be taken into consideration
- BoE Sharing
 - o Review and Action foir Christian School Proposal
 - Benefits:
 - Good way for outreach to the community
 - Better usage of the church facilities
 - Concerns:
 - Is it going to be a partnership or a landlord/tenant relationship?
 - o In the long run, sharing space with church ministries would be difficult
 - Parceling out a designated space is not easy either
 - Actions:
 - BOE to spend a week discussion the pastoral staff's opinion
 - Invite the applicant to answer questions
 - CBE Status Report
 - Promotion
 - Draft promotion video is complete

- Project promotion will be completed among each large fellowship
- Promotion brochure to be update adn mailed to each of the current past members
- Fundraising
 - First 5 months (12/18/2021 to 5/8/2022)
 - Received 34 pledges (total: \$218,940)
 - Current available CBE fund: about \$1.3M
 - Pledge and participation still lower than expected up to May
- Divid the current plan into three phases
 - Phase 1: \$2M (Fundraising: \$750K)
 - o Adding more classrooms: 14 rooms
 - Adding more offices for staff: 4 offices
 - New Indoor Gym Foundation
 - New Chapel Framing
 - Children's area renovation
 - Phase 2: \$1.1M
 - Complete New Indoor Gym
 - Phase 3: \$1.7M
 - Complete the New Chapel (355 seats)
 - Improve gravel parking lot
- Actions:
 - Called and talked to about 10 design and building contractors
 - Met with Garth Hoffman; president of Callahan/Hoffman Co, Inc. a few times in March and April with Elder Li
 - Received a quote from Callahan/Hoffman Co, Inc.
 - Design and Build
 - Phase 1: \$2,944K
 - Phase 2: \$1,094K
 - Phase III: \$995K
 - Total: \$5,033K
 - Design and permit: \$315K
 - Building: \$4,718K
 - The phase 1 cost is higher than the original budget
 - Some items from Phase 3 have to be moved into Phase 1 so that we can pass the town's building inspection
 - If the Phase 1 cost cannot be reduced, we may have to issue a member loan



 - Currently there is still Youth and Children ministries operating in the current space. Renovation will be too disruptive for these ministries
 - Once the youth move to the new facilities, then the whole space can be renovated in parts
- Could we build the multi-purpose facilities first, then the classrooms?
 - It will cost less up-front
 - It is possible to partition the space as a temporary solution

- Stewardship Report and Signage Project Update
 - Updates on Major Projects in the Pipeline
 - Children Ministry (1st Floor) Security Enhancement on hold
 - Church office roof replacement pending
 - Signage Installation in progress
 - Proposal: Church-wide window replacement
 - Many of the windows are up to 30-years old
 - It could be split up over a 3 to 5 year timespan
 - o Property Maintenance and Management
 - Support church reopening (for clean and safe environment)
 - Church-wide cleaning (leaves, branches), landscape maintenance
 - Sunday services support. Indoor and outdoor events support
 - Church office support (bills, invoices)
 - Purchase and maintain supplies and equipments
 - Repaired gas pipes and meters after leaking was observed
 - Church-wide maintenance
 - Fixing gutter
 - Smelled gas, then found gas leak
 - National Grid identified more leaking pipes and meter area



- Kitchen Ministry Lead Coworkers
 - Brother Zibiao Zhang and sister Yan Wang are willing to co-lead this ministry
 - Brother Hantai will step down
- Signage Project Update
 - Two phases
 - Gathering Team June 11 is the projected end date
 - After that, we will schedule our first meeting to brainstorm and set goals/objectives based on Minister Taylor's photos and feedback from church leadership on where the signs should go
 - Team should be cross-ministry
 - CB members identified, but we need CM members
 - Suggested team members
 - Ye Tang of Hongwei
 - Wei-Xin
 - Outdoor signs:
 - Talk to Ye/Hongwei on how to make them more presentable
 - Indoor signs:
 - Church building directory
 - Signs to point to other buildings
- Church Security and Emergency Response Discussion
 - Background
 - Berhan headed the Church Safety Committee to develop a plan on how to make the church safer
 - A large comprehensive document was created which provides training and suggestions for how to make the church secure
 - However, when Berhan's family moved, the plans went into hibernation
 - RCCC Case Study
 - There are two entrances that are actively monitored with police directing traffic

- Short-term proposal: coordinate with police to direct traffic
 - We will need to monitor two entrances (front and back entrance into the main building)
- Long-term proposal:
 - Emergency training for church staff and coworkers
- COM Case Study
 - At Ruggles, every Sunday, two brothers are assigned to monitor each entrance
- Louisville Case Study
 - Have a team of volunteers with earpieces and walkie-talkies
- Suggestions:
 - Having people standing/guarding by the entrances
 - Possibilities of closing certain entrances when services starts
 - Would having a police presence be a deterrent for newcomers?
 - Need to clear about purpose and desired results
 - Also need to have clear roles and actions for security team
 - Mass text emergency system for the whole church?
- o Action: Create a renewed church security task force
 - Immediate short-term action: church-wide announcement for each congregation to inform them that we are aware and are developing plans
 - BOE will organize a task force with representation from BOD and other fellowships
 - Revisit previous material that was developed and create training plan going forward
 - Josh Lin is suggested to be on the committee
