  - What have we learned from the pandemic?







- Supporting the Neighborhood Church Initiative
  - o Purpose: A way to give financially to other local (MA) churches
    - Many churches have seen giving drop significantly as a result of the pandemic. Churches who serve lower-income and harder-hit communities are both more vulnerable to financial hardship and vital to the people they serve
  - Plan: Fundraise from congregation with matching contribution from surplus at end of the fiscal year (\$50K)
  - Who are the neighbor churches?
    - Ask for recommendations from pastors and trusted brothers and sisters ("consultants") who know other local churches


- Churches serving communities hard-hit by COVID
- Churches with budgets hart-hit by COVID
- O Who will work on this initiative?
  - Committee members to publicize, do research as needed, manage logistics
  - One or more of our pastors to vet churches' statement of faith
- Goal:
  - Share the abundance God has provide our church
  - Grow in faith that God will provide for our own church's needs as well
  - Potential for future church partnerships -- not only giving, but also receiving the blessing of fellowship and knowing God more through brothers and sisters who are different from us (socioeconomically, culturally, ethnically) but also made in His image
    - Pray for these churches, solicit prayer requests from them
    - In-person joint projects post-pandemic
- Timeline

### **Second Floor Plan**




- Corridors will be glass enclosed and protected by the weather
