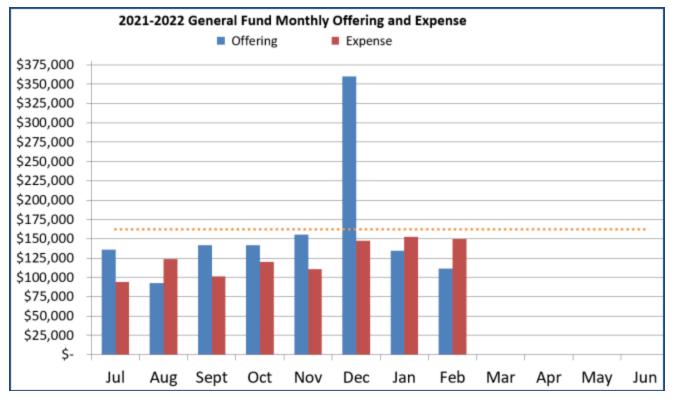

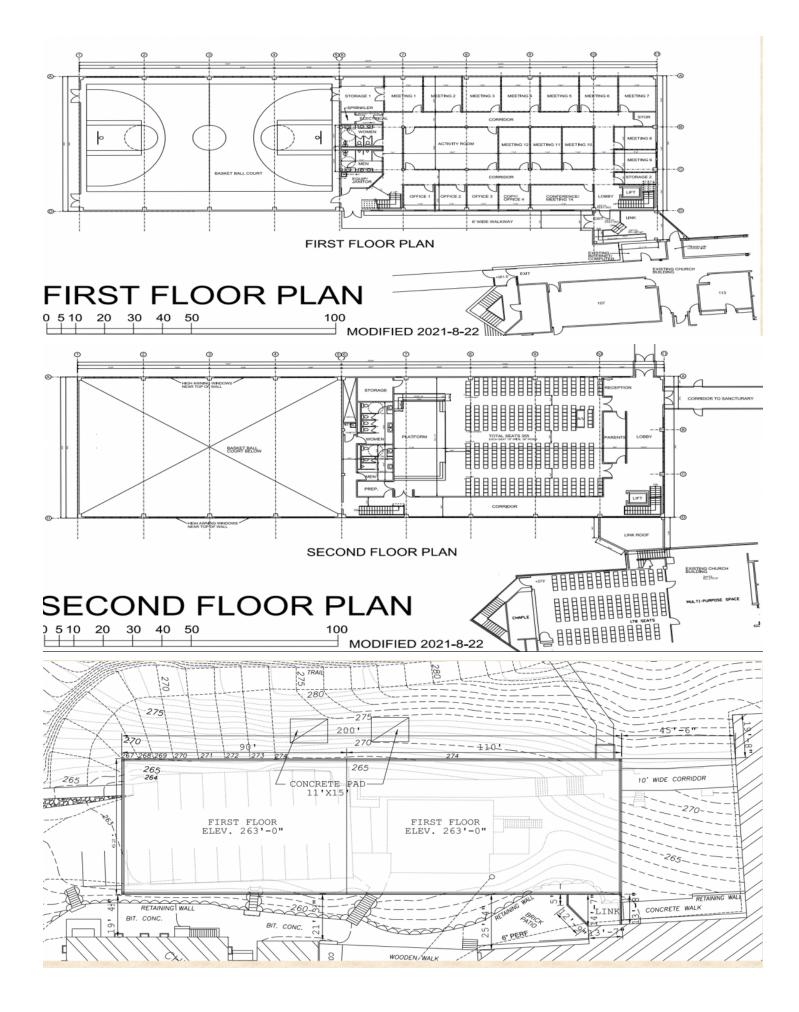

- June 2010 Church Building Expansion Team was formally established with the mission of utilizing this 2-acre land to expand church facility
- October 2010 CBET completed the master plan for the CBE project
- June 17, 2012 CBE project was presented, voted, and approved by the CBCGB congregation in a special membership meeting

- Current Focus will be on the First Phase Fundraising
 - Current Church Building Fund: \$1.25 Million
 - Current pledge Received: \$190K
 - First Phase Fundraising goal: \$750K
- Q&A and Feedback
 - What is the pastoral staff's view of this new project?
 - The current design meets the short-term ministry goals (family ministry) Children and Youth will have better facilities
 - Multi-purpose gym will give more opportunities for our church to engage with the surrounding community
 - With more facilities, we have more responsibility to fully utilize the church building
 - From a Youth Ministry perspective
 - God has abundantly blessed our community to steward well
 - A multi-purpose gym will help to further ministry reach

 - CB is being kicked out of the sanctuary CB and CM have the choice to choose which space they would like to meet in
 - This is purely a plan from the architects the plan was formed based on feedback from all ministries
- Commuter vs. Community Church
 - Our current location has a wide reach to the various areas surrounding the church
- Children Ministry Feedback:
 - Philly Families will be moved to 151
 - Bathrooms should include child-friendly features
- The CBEAT document could be summarized to highlight the requirements
- Highlighting the problem that we anticipate CBE to solve will be more impactful
- The three-phased approach appears to be more feasible
