

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

#### Discussion

- Waiting for subcontractor quote for circular driveway (fire access) for final project estimate
- Congregation concerns
  - Some in the congregation questioning the necessity of a new church building, leading to withholding financial support and asking if project should be re-voted on
  - Specific responses to the suggestion of re-voting
    - If we decided to re-vote, how are we going to explain it to those 63% of the members who voted and supported the plan?
    - There's no such provision in the CBCGB bylaws to re-vote a previously passed project. In the church's 53 year history there's no such case either.
    - The CBE project is an on-going project in the past 10-11 years as I presented in the March 2022 CC meeting. CBE Team members and other co-workers had spent hundreds and thousands of hours working on the project. How do we explain it to them?
    - There are 58 members who have already pledged to the CBE funding and more than hundred members currently donated to the CBE fund. How are we going to explain it to these members?
    - The new building at 151 Old Spring St. is part of the CBE project which has already been completed. Members are using it all the time. How can we re-vote the plan?
    - Current CBE project design is already pretty much done. Church already committed \$43K for the contractor to do the detailed drawings and to start the building permit application process.
  - Building expansion is not just for our needs today but for the future
  - Contractor currently talking to Lexington town officials and fees have been paid for their work
  - Re-voting would make the project more difficult
  - Funds already collected losing purchasing power due to inflation as time passes
- Comment that more communication needed with the congregation about CBE, and also need to be mindful of children's safety during construction
