

Finance

- Praise the Lord that during the pandemic, 2020 offering remains stable
- Average weekly missions offering slightly lower than 2019, but higher than years prior
- 61% of annual budget for staff salary and benefits
- Looking Forward (Near-Mid-Long-Term Strategies)
 - Strategy to support church vision and mission
 - Due to the Pandemic, more than 7 months of last year have been focused on closing church facilities, performing/improving online ministries and gradually reopening church facilities.
 - So, one of the near term goal for this coming year will be continuing the effort of reopening church facilities and gradually moving back to normal in-person ministries.
 Most of the goal set last year in the near, mid and long term are still valid for this year.
 - Near Term: Building pastoral team, increasing cross-ministry communication and cooperation, strengthening the coordination and cooperation of family ministry.
 - Mid Term: Church Building Expansion, Modernizing church AV System, strengthening the integration of local mission, social concern, cross-culture mission and developing high tech evangelistic media such as digital evangelism, etc.
 - Long Term: Strengthening evangelistic training, equip the saint.

Our Vision and Mission

- Reviewed and recited CBCGB Vision and Mission Statements
- Congregational prayer
- Exhortation by Pastor Juta Pan
 - James 1:2-6: "2 Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters,[a] whenever you face trials of many kinds, 3 because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. 4 Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything. 5 If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you. 6 But when you ask, you must believe and not doubt, because the

one who doubts is like a wave of the sea, blown and tossed by the wind."

- Trials typically are undesirable
 - We are all facing it during the pandemic, even if it's just an inconvenience
 - Some are facing economic struggles
 - Continue to face risk of being infected
 - Even within church, there are challenges of meeting virtually
- Can we really be joyful during this time?
 - The purpose of trials is so we can grow stronger in our faith
 - Compared to other regions, our church has been very comfortable.
 - o Can we view this time as an opportunity to have a renewed joyful attitude?
- Joy is an attitude of optimism
 - We can have joy in that after the pandemic has passed, we have faith that God will lead us to grow in our personal and spiritual life
- Optimism is built on faith in God
 - We believe that in spite of trials, God is still in control
 - God's wisdom will allow us to have a broader view
- Faith is cultivated during times of trials
- Pastor Pan has some suggestions in the annual report

Q&A and Discussion

- Q: Recently a statement was announced by CBCGB leadership regarding the US election in 2020. I have the following questions: 1. What constitutes "openly campaign[ing]"? Is there a difference between "expressing support for specific candidates" and discussing politics with fellow church members? 2. Does this extend to those who are not church members but are participating in official church meetings or social media channels? 3. Who would be responsible for enforcing these guidelines and what guidance has been given to those individuals? 4. How does Matthew 22:21 constitute Jesus instructing us to maintain a separation of church and state? What preaching may church members reference to better understand this principle? 5. From a legal/tax perspective, I understand there are certain regulations prohibiting non-profit organizations from expressing political opinions. Why is it important to maintain tax exemption and would there be any circumstances which would motivate the church to give this up? If so, can you give some examples?
 - **A:** The purpose of the church statement is to ask co-workers not to use church forums to openly campaign for a specific candidate (ie, pulpit, church communication channels).
 - This does not preclude us from caring about what's going on in our society.
 - Pastor Pan encourages the congregation to care for the current public issues and social concerns.
 - There is no absolute "correct" or "incorrect" political candidate
 - Different candidates may have different stances that are both biblical sound
 - To preserve church unity, there is no official stance from the church. Church members public campaigns for specific candidates may cause division of the church.
 - When we do discuss political issues privately, we should do so with respect.
 - The leaders (pastors, elders, presiders, SS teachers, fellowship leaders) should be responsible for enforcing guidelines
 - From the US point of view, government cannot favor a specific religious organization
 - Similarly, no religious organization can use politics to bring the privilege or advantage of specific faith and to dispel different faiths or beliefs

- Tax exemption is a byproduct of the separation of church and state
 - By favoring a specific candidate, and thus lose the tax exemption, that would damage the church's reputation
- **Q:** After the CBCGB Racial Injustice Response I don't see our church doing actions (not just sermons) to address racism and injustice in our society. Is our church willing to be socially and politically engaged to speak prophetically and to affect change?
 - A: Pastor Pan agrees that our church needs to do better in this regard.
 - Traditionally, the Chinese Church in North America has ignored social justice issues. There are three reasons that cause this tendency:
 - 1. Most Chinese churches succeed in the Christian tradition that the church should be distant from society and public issues.
 - 2. Most of our members are first generation immigrant, and usually fall behind in understanding social justice issues and feel more distant from the issue
 - 3. Since social Justice is also a complicated topic, we are reluctant to deal with them.
 - CBCGB should go beyond the announcement and take more action
 - The second generation can become a model for the first generation
